## PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a bold universal set of 17 Goals and 169 targets to help organise and streamline development actions for greater achievement of human wellbeing, while leaving no one behind – by 2030, which was adopted by 193 Member States at the historic UN General Assembly Summit in September, 2015 and came into effect on 1st January 2016. The spectrum of these Goals and Targets range from poverty eradication, human health and sanitation to urban settlements and to safeguarding the global ecosystems on which humanity depends for its survival. In the fifth year of its adoption, all Governments, multilateral development organizations, civil society, academia and think tanks across the globe are striving to adopt better, faster and more innovative ways to achieve the Goals.

India, home to one-sixth of all humanity, is alive to its role and responsibility in advancing the SDGs and unsparing in efforts to deliver on them. The Government of India is fully committed in achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In fact, the goals substantially reflect the development agenda of India, as much of India's development agenda is mirrored in the SDGs.

NITI Aayog is mandated with the task of coordinating work on SDGs by adopting a synergistic approach, involving organisations, academia and business sector to achieve India's SDG targets. A comprehensive mapping of SDG targets with schemes and programmes has been developed. This suggests an approach to sustainable development that brings together economic, social and environmental pillars, with a focus on their interlinkages.

NITI Aayog undertook a comprehensive mapping of all the centrally sponsored schemes vis-à-vis SDGs and related targets with the twin objectives of assigning responsibility of targets to ministries and ensuring every target is assigned to a ministry, leaving no target un-mapped. This helped in indicating how government schemes contribute to achievement of SDGs and shed light on gaps thereon. All line ministries that contributed to achieving specific results for each of the goals were also identified and entrusted with the responsibility of achieving specific targets. This reflects a 'whole-of-government' approach to sustainable development.

Agriculture and Allied Sectors related Ministries / Departments plays a crucial role in achieving SDGs in the country as this is directly or indirectly reflecting on almost all the Goals and most of the Targets. Like the Central Government, many of the State Governments took the appreciable steps in synergising the Agriculture and Allied Sectors related Line department's activities. The line departments have prepared their respective Annual Development Agendas which are amalgamated to form the State Annual Development Agenda. Some of the States have prepared their Vision Document as well.

Mapping of SDGs (Goals and Targets) with the line departments and their programmes (emphasising the Flagship ones) is an utmost necessity to enable the departments to align their schemes and programmes with the SDGs. All the line departments should effectively formulate and implement strategies and monitor their progress, within one framework. Some states developed draft State indicator framework and distributed to all the Departments for their interdepartmental convergence and coordination.

Though many initiatives have been taken by many states under the able facilitation of NITI Ayog, there is a lot to do in respect of building capacity of the responsible officers across the country. This programme "Enhancing the contribution of Agriculture and Allied Sectors in achieving Sustainable Development Goals" is aimed to build capacity of the responsible officers of related line departments (Agriculture, Fisheries & Aquaculture, Animal Husbandry & Dairy, Forestry, Biodiversity Conservation, Water Resource Management, Rural Development etc.), Civil Societies, Panchayat Raj Institutions and other institutions, to strengthen the planning, implementation and monitoring of sectoral SDG Plans, focusing on Agriculture & Allied Sectors related SDGs like Goal 2 (Zero Hunger), 8 (Economic Growth), 14 (Life below water) and 15 (Life on Land), at all level in a more meaningful way.

## PARTICIPANT PROFILE

The participants may include Senior and Mid-Level Government Officials from State Planning Departments, Agriculture & Allied Sectors related Line departments like Agriculture, Fisheries & Aquaculture, Forestry, Water Resource Management, Environment, Panchayat Raj & Rural Development, etc. The Officials from Industry / CSR Foundations, Development Banks, NGOs/INGOs who work in the related areas may also attend this programme.

## VENUE

The programme is fully residential and the participants will be accommodated in air conditioned single occupancy rooms. The College does not provide accommodation for the family. College will arrange transport between airport / railway station and venue. The College is WiFi enabled in a comprehensive way.

## DURATION

The programme duration is from **May 4 - 6, 2020**. The participants are expected to arrive a day before commencement and may leave after the conclusion of the programme.

## PROGRAMME FEE

Residential Fee: Rs. 39,000/- (US \$720 for foreigners) plus GST as applicable, presently 18% per participant. The fee covers tuition, board and lodging, courseware (in electronic form) and other facilities of the College including internet usage.

Non-Residential Fee: Rs.33,000/- plus GST as applicable, presently 18% per participant. The fee covers tuition, course ware (in electronic form) working lunch and other facilities of the College including internet usage.

A discount of 10% on the Programme fee for three or more participants from the same organisation will be given, provided the payment is credited into our Bank account before May 1, 2020.
